






St. Anne's football academy is up and running and we have 50 children who make the journey to Peter Lloyd's Sports Centre every Wednesday after school to develop and show off their football skills. Can we please remind you that school dinner money for junior children is to be paid for weekly **in advance**. The cost of a school dinner is £1.80 per day, £9.00 per full school week. All children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal. Any arrears of dinner money will be pursued by the school. If you think you may be entitled to an income related free school meal, please visit https://liverpool.gov.uk/free-school-meals or visit your Local Authority website if outside of Liverpool.



For the last academic year, our whole school attendance was 95.9% which is below our target of 97%. Let's see if we can reach our target this year!

This year will see the continuation of the St. Anne's awards for attendance. If children receive a full term in the academic year at 100% attendance they will receive the bronze award, a bronze medal that they can wear with pride. Two full terms in the academic year will see the silver medal and the full academic year at 100% will see the gold medal awarded. We also have a termly £50 prize draw where all children with 100% attendance are entered. We thank you for supporting the aim of full attendance for all and not booking holidays during term time.

We also have ongoing awards in school on a weekly and daily basis- a £5.00 prize is awarded to the class with the highest attendance each week. Classes also gain an extra 50p for each day they have 100% attendance and punctuality. At the end of each term, the children add up the money in their class piggy bank and spend it on a treat of their choice. Children who are in school and on time every day are entered into a weekly raffle and the winner can choose a prize from the class prize box.

Keep up the good work and see how many bronze attendance awards we can give out at the end of term to children with 100%.


After half term Year 4 will begin their swimming sessions. Swimming is now on a Tuesday and the children are to come to school in their PE kits on swimming day as well as PE day.
