



# Our Nursery Newsletter

We have been looking at our bodies and what is inside them this week. We read a really interesting book called 'Boris's Body' which told us about our heart, lungs, brain and our skeleton and it helped to explain some of the important jobs that they do. We learnt the names of some of our bones including our skull, spine and ribs and we found out that our brain is wobbly just like a jelly!



Later on in the week, we read a really funny story about some skeletons call "Funnybones" which we enjoyed lots. We made our own "Funnybone skeletons" in our collage area and we used scissors to cut straws up to make bones for our special pictures - our teachers think our skeletons look great 😊

We have also been practising our counting this week (we had funnybone bones hidden in our sand pit!) 
