


Our Nursery Newsletter

We started off the week by reading a very exciting story called "How to grow a dinosaur". We liked the story so much that we decided to have a go at growing our own dinosaurs (Miss Search ordered us some very special eggs from Hong Kong!) ☺ The children choose which coloured 'egg' they wanted to place in their plastic cup



before carefully covering it with water. We all had a lovely surprise the following morning when we came into school and found that the eggs had hatched and the children are looking forward to seeing which type

of dinosaur species that they have in their cup as well as seeing how big our dinosaurs will grow before taking them home next week ☺

We have also learnt about the Tyrannosaurs Rex including some very interesting facts about this huge dinosaur. The children have learnt that the T-Rex walks on two legs (not four) and that he is a meat eater (a carnivore). They have found out that the Tyrannosaurs is so enormous in size that the mummy dinosaur cannot even sit on her own eggs! Instead she has to build a special nest out of rotten plants to keep her eggs warm and safe (the rotten plants mean that her nest is extremely smelly!) The children were also very interested to find out that the T-Rex's teeth are so sharp that they can bite into any other animal's skin and that their bite is stronger than that of three modern day lions - how impressive is that?!?
