Key Stage 2 Attainment

- •**Reading:** 87% of pupils scored 100+ in the reading test which was 21% above the national average. 30% attained a high scale score (greater depth) which was 11% above the national average. The **average scaled score** was 105.9 compared with 102.6 nationally.
- Writing: 76% of pupils attained the expected standard which was 2% above the national average. 7% attained greater depth which was 8% below the national average.
- •Maths: 87% of pupils scored 100+ in the maths test which was 17% above the national average. 17% attained a high scale score (greater depth) which matched the national average. The average scaled score was 104.2 compared with 103.0 nationally.
- •Combined: 65% of pupils attained the expected standard in all three subjects (reading, writing and maths) which was 12% above the national average. 7% attained a high standard (greater depth) in all three subjects which was 2% above the national average.
- English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: 80% of pupils scored 100+ in the EGPS tests which was 8% above the national average. 15% attained a high scaled score (greater depth) which 7% below the national average. The average scaled score was 103.9 compared with 104.0 nationally.

PROGRESS FROM KEY STAGE 1

- **Reading:** The **progress measure** for reading was **+2.99**. Taking account of the confidence interval, at best this could be +4.82 and at its worst, it could be +1.16. This is significantly positive and places the school in the top 14% for progress in reading.
- Writing: The progress measure for writing was -0.4. Taking account of the confidence interval, at best this could be +1.45 and at its worst, it could be -2.25.
- interval, at best this could have been -2.25 and at worst, -2.71.
- Maths: The progress measure for maths was +0.92. Taking account of the confidence interval, at best this could be +2.48 and at its worst, it could be -0.64.
