A short piece of maths homework will be set each week. Spellings will be sent home to be learned from time to time, as and when appropriate. Please continue to help your child to read every night, encouraging the use of expression and asking questions about what has been read. Please continue to sign the reading diary. It is vital that your child has his / her reading book in school every day, as reading activities take place most days.
