Each class has enjoyed taking part in cookery lessons with James making many tasty foods. We hope you have heard- and hopefully tasted some of the exciting foods the children have made. Here is a review from a child in Year 6 about their first session when they made fish cakes.

'On Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2019, Year 6 had a cooking lesson. A man called James taught us all how to make fish cakes. Before we began, James taught us all about nutrition and hygiene. We all washed our hands before we started.

We used tuna, potatoes, parsley, spring onion and bread crumbs. We peeled the potatoes, sliced the spring onions and snipped the parsley. The whole experience was great.'



Bullybusters trained a group of children from Year 5 and 6 to become 'Peer Mentors'. Their role is to help and support children during break times. They all have a special badge so that they are easily identified by the whole school. They have an important role to play in supporting children to resolve conflicts. We know the team will do an amazing job!



Elsie in Year 6 really enjoyed her month in duty as Junior Lord Mayor which was in December. We are extremely proud of her achievements. She is a credit to her family and to our school. Here is a report from Elsie about her experience:

'I was the Junior Lord Mayor for the month of December. When I first started being Junior Lord Mayor, I knew it would be a privilege but I didn't know it would be so much hard work. I went with the Lord Mayor of Liverpool to many different events. Some events meant I missed school which I was not happy about! I had to speak to people about the privilege and roll of being the Junior Lord Mayor. I had to do some unplanned speeches, which is always a challenge, and I had many photographs taken at the events. So many children have told me that they want to be like me when they grow up which makes me feel very proud! This is just a snippet of what I have done and I am really enjoying it. So for any children who want to be a member of parliament or the prime minister- start as a child. Start small!'





In January, members of our School Parliament attended the Holocaust Memorial Day at Liverpool Town Hall. There were four speakers- a young lady Megan, whose grandfather was able to escape Nazi Germany. Also, John, Fay and Sonia, who were all 90 years+, told their remarkable stories on how they escaped from the Nazi regime. This was a very moving afternoon and it brings home how lucky we are to live in a free society.

In March, our School Parliament attended a meeting at the Town Hall. They were given a very interesting opportunity to learn about different types of voting in elections. The guest speaker was Rida Laraki from Liverpool University. They also had the opportunity to try out the different voting options which gave some very interesting and unexpected results. As always our children were a credit to St Anne's.



Our Young Voices Choir attended Manchester Arena to perform in a choir of thousands of children. The 44 members of the choir, which is made up of children from Year 4, 5 and 6, spent many months rehearsing to perfect the many songs and dance moves. We stopped off at McDonalds on the way for lunch to make sure we had a hot meal for the day. It was a fantastic experience for all involved and the children were impeccably behaved throughout the very long day- we did not return to school until 10.30pm! The children are looking forward to attending again next year!



The children enjoyed supporting the NSPCC Number Day by dressing up in their own clothes with numbers and patterns on. Lots of extra maths activities were completed during the day across the school. Thank you to all families that donated towards this very worthy cause.



Reception children have been working with Callum from 'Bikeability'. Callum brought ten balance bikes and Reception children practised controlling and mastering the basic bike skills in the safety of our school playground. Over the six sessions it was lovely to watch the children's confidence grow in learning how to prepare themselves and the bikes for cycling. They practised getting on and off without any help and moving around in different directions and stopping on command. Children became more aware of how to hold themselves and balance when gliding and how to apply the breaks for shorter and longer stopping distances. The children really enjoyed their weekly sessions and have had lots of fun with Callum.







To celebrate National Science week, we invited rangers from Chester Zoo into school to discuss their involvement in Science. The junior departments enjoyed finding out about the effects of rubbish, left in the environments, on our animals. Plastic materials have become a huge threat to both sea and land life with some animals becoming extinct as a result. The infants enjoyed taking part in a mini-beast hunt and identifying Science of spring. A range of mini-beasts were carefully examined! We look forward to more Science workshops in the terms ahead.



Every class in the school have been lucky enough to take part in a workshop with RSPB. Nursery were that inspired that they bought some 'fat balls' and a bird feeder to hang up in their outside area. They are looking forward to looking at what birds visit our school grounds.



Year Six took part in a 'Crucial Crew' multi-agency safety event in Childwall Academy. 'Crucial Crew' teaches children about important issues such as hate crime, anti-social behaviour, travel safety, fire safety and on-line safety. The interactive safety workshops were delivered by the emergency services and local safety agencies. They gave the children the unique opportunity to learn valuable skills, through practical demonstrations, hands-on activities and real life situations. The children really enjoyed the event and learnt so much about keeping safe!



Year two children have been taking part in the 'Hands' sign language programme. The children have learnt to sign along to songs and how to sign names of animals amongst many other things. The children enjoyed demonstrating their new signing skills to their parents and carers in a special assembly during family event week. A big thank you to the staff from Deaf Active for delivering these sessions.



Easy Peasy home learning programme has been introduced in the Nursery and Reception classes. An introductory workshop was very well attended and the majority of parents are accessing it on a weekly basis. Feedback from parents has been really positive and is encouraging parents to engage in a wide range of activities at home.



Our group of Year 5 and 6 children returned to the Dutch Farm this month now that spring is well and truly here. Down on the farm the daffodils, which they planted in late autumn, are now in full bloom. The trees have blossom and some have new buds beginning to appear. The raised beds had some weeds growing once again, so their first task was to clear the area ready to plant some potatoes. They had to mix in some compost and dig a trench before planting the potatoes which will hopefully be ready in the summer. The chickens had laid seventeen eggs and they were allowed to bring these back to school. The children and staff are really enjoying their time at the farm and they are learning so much about planning and caring for the environment.



The new EYFS outdoor shelter is nearly finished, we are just waiting for the shutters to be fitted. Many thanks for your support and patience during the building work and a big well done to the children for 'getting on with things' and becoming even more independent than they already were.



EYFS took part in workshops about looking after their teeth. This was delivered by a member of staff from the local Sure Start centre. Children had the opportunity to dress up as dentists and brush a crocodile's teeth!!





Key Stage One children visited 'Imagine That!' in Wavertree. They had a wonderful time taking part in all the fabulous Art, Construction and Science activities and exploring all the different role play areas. They particularly enjoyed learning to cross the road safely and dressing up! The children's behaviour on the visit was outstanding!! Nursery and Reception are looking forward to their visit in the summer term.



We are pleased to announce that Year Four and Five are participating in the Barnardo's LifeSkills programme. LifeSkills is an evidence based programme that provides children and young people with the skills to make positive healthy choices. As well as preventing substance misuse, it also leads to important improvements in other core skills which are key for healthy development amongst young people. These include self-esteem, communication, social skills and ability to cope with stress. Recent research by Barnardo's has proven LifeSkills to be successful in helping young people communicate clearly, develop healthy relationships, build resilience and deal with pressure, skills that will help children and young people have healthier and more enjoyable lives!



Year Four pupils visited The Royal Liverpool
Philharmonic Hall on Monday 4th March. During the
visit the children watched the musical concert
'Sound Values' which explored music and society
and how British Values links with some of our
favourite pieces of classical music. The children
