English	Text Work	Fiction	The Butterfly Lion - Michael Morpurgo English lessons will be based around the reading of this book, looking at author's writing techniques for hooking the reader, use of the 1 st and 3 rd person and effective use of language such as similes and metaphors. The children will be encouraged to empathise with the characters and have lots of opportunities for their own narrative writing, using this text as a stimulus.
		Non-fiction	Non-fiction text types will be covered through our reading of The Butterfly Lion: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Diary entries - Newspaper articles
		Sentence Work	Adverbs, Prepositions, Verbs, Adjectives, Direct Speech, Pronouns
		Word Work	Spelling patterns and rules, High frequency words, Using a dictionary and thesaurus.
Maths	<p>Measure - Know the number of seconds in a minute and the number of days in each month, year and leap year; Tell and write the time from an analogue clock, including Roman Numerals from I to XII, and 12-hour and 24-hour clocks; Compare duration of events, for example to calculate the time taken by particular events or tasks; Add and subtract amounts of money to give change, using both £ and p in practical contexts; Measure, compare, add and subtract lengths (m/cm/mm), volume/capacity (l/ml), mass (kg/g); Measure the perimeter of simple 2D shapes; Add and subtract amounts of money to give change using both £ and p in practical contexts</p> <p>Geometry - Draw 2D shapes and make 3D shapes using modelling materials; Recognise 3D shapes in different orientations and describe them; Recognise that angles are a property of shape or a description of a turn; Identify right angles, recognise that two right angles make a half turn, three make three quarters of a turn, and four make a complete turn, Identify whether angles are greater than or less than a right angle, Identify horizontal and vertical lines and pairs of perpendicular and parallel lines</p>
