- Initiates conversations, attends to and takes account of what others say.
- Confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions.
- Aware of the boundaries set, and of behavioural expectations.

Literacy

- Hears and says initial sounds in words.
- Segments sounds in simple words and blends them together.
- Links sounds to letters.
- Begins to read words and simple sentences.
- Enjoys and increasing range of books.
- Writes own name, labels and captions.

Understanding the World

- Enjoys joining in with family customs and routines.
- Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change.
- Uses ICT hardware to interact with age appropriate computer software.

Communication and Language

- Listens attentively in a range of situations.
- Follows a story without pictures or props.
- Uses talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.



Expressive Arts and Design

- Explores what happens when they mix colours.
- Experiments to create different textures.
- Understands that different media can be combined to create new effects.
- Introduces a storyline or narrative into their play.
- Creates simple representations of events, people and objects.

Physical Development

- Negotiates space successfully when playing racing and chasing games with other children, adjusting speed or changing direction to avoid obstacles.
- Travels with confidence and skill around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment.
- Uses a correct pencil grip and is beginning to use anticlockwise movements and retrace vertical lines.
- Is aware of and can talk about good practise in regard to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene.

Mathematics

- Counts objects to 10 and beyond.
- Selects the correct numeral to represent 1 to 10 objects.
- Finds one more and one less.
- Begins to use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting.
- Uses mathematical language to describe shapes.
- Orders by length or height.
- Measures periods of time in simple ways.

- Takes account of others' ideas.
- Say why they like some activities more than others.

Literacy

- Estimates how many they can see and checks by counting.
- Finds the total number in two groups.
- Records, using marks that they can interpret and explain.
- Identifies own maths problems based on own interests.
- Orders items by weight or capacity.
- Uses everyday language related to money.
- Describes their relative position.
