Techniques



I know how to create an abstract sculpture from recycled materials by arranging the materials into patterns.



I know how to use recycled materials to construct an instrument, decorating it with a pattern of consistent size and shape.

Vocabulary

Symmetrical-Reflection:
A figure which does not change upon undergoing a reflection has reflectional symmetry.

Symmetrical Pattern:
A pattern that is identical on both halves when folded. Symmetrical patterns can have multiple lines of symmetry.

Geometric Pattern:
A pattern depicting abstract, nonrepresentational shapes such as lines, circles, triangles and polygons.

Flip Pattern:
A pattern created by tracing pictures into squares of a quadrant.

Serif:
A stroke added as a stop to the beginning and end of the main strokes of a letter.



I know how to use a compass accurately to divide a circle into arcs to recreate the flower of life pattern.



I know how to apply techniques of reflection and symmetry to create a flip pattern.



I know how to use geometric shapes to make a stamp. I know how to print repeating patterns, varying both configuration and colour.
