Lest We Forget

The red poppy remembers those who were killed and those who fought alongside them.

The Royal British Legion is a charity that provides financial, social and emotional support to veterans and members of the British Armed Forces, their families and dependants.

Zip pulls start with a suggested donation of 50p, reflectors 50p, silicon wristbands £1 and snap bands £1.50. Traditional paper poppies also have a suggested donation of 50p.
