Thank you for supporting Children in Need today. Everyone looked fantastic dressed in yellow and/or spots. We had a lovely day completing Pudsey themed activities, especially decorating cakes made by our kitchen staff.



You may have heard your child using the phrase 'special friends', this is linked to phonics. We have been focusing on two letters that make one sound for example **'sh'**- **'sh'** **'o'** **'p'** -**'shop'** , **'ch'**- **'ch'**, **'a'**, **'t'**- **'chat'**, **'th'**- **'th'** **'i'** **'n'**- **'thin'** . We had a try at writing words with special friends and were very proud at how focused children are when forming letters.

This week is 'World Nursery Rhyme Week' . Nursery rhymes are important to young children, they are a learning source in early literacy and help to develop an ear for language. Both rhyme and rhythm help children hear the sounds and syllables in words, which helps learning to read. We have been listening to and joining in with nursery rhymes and putting our own fully spin on them such as "Twinkle, twinkle little star, my dad drives a rusty old car."
