We have been learning how to stay safe online for 'Internet Safety Week'. We listened to an online story about a penguin called 'Smartie' which promoted online safety. The message given was when playing online games on an iPad, tablet or on Mummy's or Daddy's phone, a grownup should be sitting with them and if anything popped up that shouldn't be there, they do not click but tell someone. We learnt the following rhyme to help us remember this important message, "Before you click, click, click, you need to think, think, think and tell someone".
