

Dear Parents/Carers Friday 18th March 2022

We came across two new words and added them to our 'book vocabulary' list this week—nocturnal and co-coon. We have enjoyed a range of fiction and non-fiction books about nocturnal animals and 'daytime' animals. This linked well with the EYFS curriculum area 'Understanding the World'—what we see, hear and feel when outside. We spoke about what animals we might see during the day time on our way to school, if we visit a farm or a zoo. Then, if we were out very late at night what animals would we expect to see from the information we have learnt when reading non-fiction books.

'The Very Hungry Caterpillar ' is an all time favourite story book. We read this during story time and it prompt lots of discussions such as - healthy and unhealthy foods the caterpillar ate, what a 'cocoon' is and what it would have been like inside the cocoon. Then, we looked carefully at the picture of the butterfly and all its beautiful bright colours. Some children also noticed how the butterfly was the same on both sides (symmetrical). This led to our creative area being very busy, caterpillars were being made using bottle tops and felt material, butterflies were coloured in to complete the symmetrical pattern. We then designed our own butterflies using 'chubby paint pens', encouraging children to think about symmetry.

A focus for maths this half term is recalling number bonds 0-5. This week we have focused this. We have used a Jack Hartman song on You Tube –number bonds to 5, that includes actions to support learning. Multi-link cubes, numicon and our fingers were used to carry out number investigations to make 5.
