Researchers at Imperial College London invited both Year 4 and Year 5 children from our school to take part in an exciting air pollution project. Participation in the project was voluntary, but those pupils wished to take part enjoyed an informative lesson were they learnt about air pollution. Our Year 4 and Year 5 volunteers were then given backpacks with pollution sensors concealed inside them so that samples of air from their school commutes could be collected. The project hopes to raise awareness of air pollution issues for children in Liverpool and give them some recommendations for what they can do to reduce their exposure to air pollution in the city.
