Dear Parents and Carers,

Many thanks for your support over the past few weeks in settling your children into Nursery. It is lovely to see the progress already being made by the children as they transition into our school.

For information on what your child will be learning in Nursery please see the **Nursery Curriculum Map** on the **Nursery Class Page** on the school website. A big focus in Nursery is on the Prime Areas of Learning which are Communication and Language, Personal, Social and Emotional Development and Physical Development. Specific Areas of Learning we also focus on, are Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. For more information on all of these areas please have a look at the school website under **EYFS**.

Time is spent each day learning and singing Nursery Rhymes. Studies show Nursery Rhymes can help to develop key developmental skills in early literacy by enabling children to become interested in the rhythm and patterns of language. Nursery Rhymes introduce children to new words (which is a big focus within the Nursery), help children recognise the sounds in words, develop fine and gross motor skills (whilst doing actions matching the rhyme), develop numeracy skills, e.g. counting and most importantly strengthen the bond between yourself and your child by "being in the moment" together. Children who are exposed to Nursery Rhymes at an early age are often the children who do well in school especially in Literacy.
