

## **Personal, Social, Health, Education (PSHEe)**

### **Vision**

PSHE is a subject through which pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to keep themselves healthy and safe, prepared for life and work. Here at St Anne Stanley we want to prepare our children for the future by encouraging the development of characteristics for life such as a love of learning, resilience, integrity, team work, critical thinking and independence. Our school is a nurturing learning environment in which each child is encouraged to develop their full potential and where their achievements and successes are celebrated and rewarded. As a school we believe that children our individuals and therefore, we aim to encourage mutual respect, responsibility and foster self-esteem in a happy and caring atmosphere. The teaching and learning of PSHEe supports and upholds this vision. PSHE is taught throughout the school in such a way as to reflect the overall aims, values and ethos of the school.

### **Intent**

PSHEe enables our children to become healthy, independent and responsible members of society. It aims to help them understand how they are developing personally and socially, and tackles many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up. Here at St Anne Stanley We use a combination of My Happy Minds Plus PSHEe Planning as the main body for our teaching (Nursery through to Year 6.) The Christopher Winter Project for Drug/Alcohol and Sex and Relationship Education enhances our curriculum.

P4C and British Values are incorporated in all subjects and not just PSHEe.

Through the key stages there is progression and development so that skills are embedded and built upon over key stages.

Knowledge and understanding of the world is taught in our Early years and this gives a basic understanding of PSHEe ready to lead into year 1.

We provide our children with opportunities for them to learn about rights and responsibilities and appreciate what it means to be a member of a diverse society. Our children are encouraged to develop their sense of self-worth by playing a positive role in contributing to school life and the wider community.

### **Impact**

Our school values, inclusion and safeguarding within our curriculum is vital, as first and foremost we want our children to be safe and happy so that they can excel in all aspects of school life. Our carefully planned and tailored PSHEe curriculum provides all pupils with a chance to reflect and learn about these elements. The spiralling curriculum ensures full and deep coverage of all PSHEe topics and helps children to develop a positive, healthy outlook towards life. Children will demonstrate and apply the British Values of Democracy, Tolerance, Mutual Respect, Rule of Law and Liberty.

Learning from reception to 6 will be recorded within individual PSHEe pupil books. Learning in Nursery will be evident in the children's individual learning journey. Monitoring and assessment of PSHE is an ongoing process and teachers will use assessment for learning to inform future planning and implementation of lessons. Here at St Anne Stanley our children are happy learners within PSHE.
