At St Anne (Stanley), we want every child to feel safe, happy, and ready to learn. Our approach to behaviour is rooted in **relationships**, **respect**, **and responsibility**.

Our Core Beliefs

- Children thrive in a nurturing environment with high expectations.
- Behaviour is a form of communication; it tells us how a child is feeling.
- Positive behaviour must be taught, modelled, and celebrated.
- Mistakes are part of learning children deserve a fresh start each day.
- Fairness means giving each child what they need, not always the same as others.

How We Support Behaviour

- Staff build strong relationships with children and families.
- We use **emotion coaching** to help children understand and manage feelings.
- Consistent routines across school help children feel safe.
- Restorative conversations repair relationships when things go wrong.
- Children with additional needs receive personalised support.

Recognising Positive Behaviour

We celebrate good behaviour, effort, and kindness in many ways, including:

- Praise and encouragement.
- Stickers, certificates, and "Star of the Day."
- House points and whole-class rewards.
- "Star of the Week" certificate and a phone call home.
- Golden Award for pupils who go above and beyond.

When Behaviour Goes Wrong

- Staff respond calmly and fairly, helping children reflect and make better choices.
- Consequences are always linked to behaviour and never designed to shame.
- Parents/carers are informed if behaviour becomes a concern.
- Serious or repeated behaviours are supported by senior staff.
- Physical restraint is only ever used to keep children and others safe.

Working with Parents/Carers

We believe home and school should work together to give children consistent messages. Parents can help by:

- Talking about our Golden Rules and values at home.
- Supporting children to be independent and responsible.
- Sharing any concerns about their child's wellbeing with us.
